## ORDINANCE NO. 348

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF CLYDE HILL, WASHINGTON, ESTABLISHING THE SALARY FOR THE OFFICE OF MAYOR, REAFFIRMING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF SALARIES FOR THE CITY COUNCIL, AND ESTABLISHING A NEW SALARY FOR CITY COUNCIL MEMBERS EFFECTIVE FOR THOSE COUNCIL MEMBERS WHO ARE NEWLY OR RE-ELECTED TO POSITIONS COMMENCING ON OR AFTER JANUARY 1, 2004.

WHEREAS, under Chapter 35A.12, the salary and/or benefits for the position of Mayor may be increased during the Mayor's term provided the Mayor does not vote concerning said matter; and

WHEREAS, in 1983, the then Town Council established salaries for the City Council at \$50 per meeting up to 14 meetings per year, and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to reaffirm said salaries and to increase the salary for the Mayor and increase the salaries for City Council Members who are newly elected or reelected and take office on or after January 1, 2004; NOW, THEREFORE,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLYDE HILL DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The salary for the position of Mayor shall be \$100 per month and \$100 per regular Council meeting or study session, or other meeting where the Mayor is the designated representative of the City not to exceed a total of 30 meetings in any calendar year.

Section 2. The salary for the City Council is reaffirmed as established in 1983 to be \$50 per meeting and is reaffirmed to be up to 14 regular City Council meetings or study sessions per year, or other meetings where a Council Member is designated to represent the City.

Section 3. For City Council Members who are re-elected or elected for the first time to a term commencing on or after January 1, 2004, the salary shall be \$50 per regular City Council meeting or study session, or other meeting where the Council Member is the designated representative of the City not to exceed a total of 30 meetings in any calendar year.

Section 4. If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance should be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of any other section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force five (5) days after publication of the attached approved summary thereof consisting of the title.
